A Life of Peace by Charles Stanley.

Let's suppose I've got a problem that has my stomach in knots with persistent worry. Friends and family try to be understanding, but after a time they grow weary of me taking my anguish out on them. I'm so focused on this issue that it feels as if I'm carrying a heavy load on my shoulders. The Lord offers a liberating alternative: "Cast your burden upon [Me] and [I] will sustain you" (Psalm 55:22 Cast your burden upon the LORD and He will sustain you; He will never allow the righteous to be shaken). Though He doesn't erase the ills that invade this life, He instead shields us from the weight of worry by taking our situation into His own hands.

However, the call to a peaceful life is impossible without confidence in the Lord. That trust is built through a relationship with Him—praying through trials and triumphs, seeking His guidance, and testing His Word to see that it is true and practical for life.

When we've experienced God's faithfulness and believe He will continue to act on behalf of His followers (Isa. 64:4 For from days of old they have not heard or perceived by ear, Nor has the eye seen a God besides You, Who acts in behalf of the one who waits for Him), that's when peace is possible. In fact, it is not only possible but promised to the believer who trusts in Him (Phil. 4:6-7 ⁶ Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus). But unshakeable peace isn't instantaneous; it is cultivated through a consistent relationship with the Lord.
