If there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith." 1 Cor. 15:1-4,12-14.

Because Christ has risen from the dead, all who believe in the gospel gain eternal life. In a world that is overshadowed by death- the Christian is filled with life and hope. Life that overcomes death. This should produce a joy that surpasses all understanding within us.

This hope of eternal life allows us to look forward to a reunion in heaven with all those who have believed and have gone on before. What a glorious day! It also should help us to prioritize our lives with a view of eternity.
