They stopped worshipping (serving) the Lord and worshipped (served) other gods.

They envied others whom they saw as blessed more than they were.

They despised their leaders and hated where God had led them.

They complained and grumbled before God and their leaders and despised where he wanted to take them. In summary- they didn't trust Him.

We are all waiting for God to move in some way in our lives. Let us not give in to these things that can ruin the blessings God has for us. May we remember that in those things that God says "no" to He knows what is best for us and will give us the grace to continue in faith and joy never failing to sing praises to Him.
