
A Mighty Fortress Is Our God

Basic Timeline of Church History from Pentecost to the Protestant Reformation

Who Was Martin Luther?

The son of a German iron miner in 16th century Germany. Luther instead of obeying his father, entered seminary, became a monk and studied to become a priest. But he found little comfort in the Roman Catholic Church and was constantly troubled by his own sinfulness and fear of hell. He was tormented continually in his spirit. Providentially however Luther was appointed as a professor of theology at the university in Wittenberg and began to study the Bible. This changed his life.

One day he came across this verse in Romans: "The righteous shall live by faith." Rom 1:17. Luther learned from this that what he had come to believe about how to acquire salvation was wrong. The practices of pilgrimages, fasting and other good works had no effect on his eternal destiny. Troubled by the errors of the church, in particular the evils of selling indulgences in exchange for the promise of eternal life, Luther decided to open up a debate on the issues. On October 31, 1517 he posted an invitation for debate on the door of the seminary Church. Little did Luther know the significance that act would have in his own life and in millions of others- including you and I!. His ninety-five theses were copied and eventually distributed all across Germany. Providentially the Gutenberg printing press was now on the scene and Luther's writings soon found their way to the Pope. To the Catholic Papacy, Martin's teachings were heresy. Enough for him to be burned at the stake. It was soon demanded that Luther recant of everything he had come to believe. His response was: "My conscience has been taken captive by God, I cannot remove anything, nor do I wish to. Here I stand, I cannot do otherwise, so help me, God."

What followed were years of councils and hearings and writing his defense of His beliefs. He hid, Aided by Frederick the Wise from those who wanted him done away with. As a result, and not by intent, Luther became the leader of a whole new fellowship of churches that broke away from Rome. This gave birth to protestant churches. We should praise God for these events over 500 years ago!
