We have had our share of bad news in recent days. The Russian invasion of Ukraine has revealed the tragic results of war and the human propensity for evil. Our own city streets are nearly a warzone themselves. But recently I read an article on goodnewsnetwork.org showing the care and compassion that humanity can display in the face of such evil.

An image recently shared around social media of empty strollers on a Polish rail border crossing has inspired a mountain of donations for Ukrainian refugees. Now at Przemyśl Station, women, children, and infants fleeing the war are being greeted by mountains of clothes, stuffed animals, strollers, diapers, and more after they step off the train. ABC reports that the number of spare carriers and strollers from Polish mothers have been particularly inspiring, with many donators leaving handwritten notes behind, with words of support. "We see on the television and hear on the radio what happened, and we say, 'okay we can help.'"

One of the signs of the end of the age and the return of Christ is that the love of most will grow cold. Cruelty will be on the rise, lack of concern for one another will increase- for the Christian, this is where difficulty turns into opportunity! When compassion is hard to find-people will still be in need of it, and we followers of Jesus are equipped to show it. Let me challenge you- instead of looking to how no one else is compassionate or kind, you choose to be more compassionate, and kind. This kind of action does cost us something- either in time, talent, or treasure. But let us heed the word of the LORD. James 2:15-17 "Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. ¹⁶ If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? ¹⁷ In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead. Let us follow the example of those polish mothers... in so doing we show the compassion of Christ. – Pastor Paul
