**SERMON: Created to Worship** part 1

**Scriptures:** 1 Cor. 10:31; Job 38:1-7; Isaiah 6:1-4; Rev. 4:2-11; Ezek. 28:11-15; Isaiah 14:12-14; Genesis 3:1-23; Rom 1:20-21; Rev. 13:11-17; Psalm 148

What are your first memories of worshipping God? How old were you? Where were you?  
What were your thoughts, impressions, feelings? Who were you with?

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What is Worship? In the original languages of the Bible worship foundationally means to bow down and prostrate oneself. It means to honor and praise. The English word Worship comes from the Old English word worth-ship. It is the condition of being worthy or deserving.

We are to Worship God in all that we do, wherever we are. In the Christian heart and mind there is to be no division between the secular and the sacred.

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To our knowledge, angels, including Satan were the first to worship God.

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Humans were created to worship God, but they, like Satan and other demons are fallen as well.

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Who will be worshipped as God is the question that has be center to al things from eternity past till God – Jehovah creates a new heaven and a new earth.

The Bible makes it Clear that there is only one God – Jehovah who is to be worshipped. And the Bible has revealed Him to Us in three substiances or persons- Father, Son and Spirit.

And he...pitched his tent, having Beth-el on the west and Ai on the east:  
and there he builded an altar. — Genesis 12:8 (RV)

Worship is giving God the best that He has given you. Be careful what you do with the best you have. Whenever you get a blessing from God, give it back to Him as a love gift. Take time to meditate before God and offer the blessing back to Him in a deliberate act of worship. If you hoard a thing for yourself, it will turn into spiritual dry rot, as the manna did when it was hoarded. God will never let you hold a spiritual thing for yourself, it has to be given back to Him that He may make it a blessing to others.

Bethel is the symbol of communion with God; Ai is the symbol of the world. Abraham pitched his tent between the two. The measure of the worth of our public activity for God is the private profound communion we have with Him. Rush is wrong every time; there is always plenty of time to worship God. Quiet days with God may be a snare.

We have to pitch our tents where we shall always have quiet times with God, however noisy our times with the world may be. There are not three stages in spiritual life — worship, waiting and work. Some of us go in jumps like spiritual frogs, we jump from worship to waiting, and from waiting to work. God's idea is that the three should go together. They were always together in the life of Our Lord. He was unhesitating and unrelenting. It is a discipline, we cannot get into it all at once.
