Foundations of Worship

Scriptures: Matt. 2:1-11; Acts 17:22-28; Col. 3:16-18; Job 38:1-7;
Rev. 4:4-11; Is. 6:5; Acts 9:4; John 18:4-6; Josh. 5:13-15; Rom1:20-25; Ps. 148:1-13

Introduction: Over the next several weeks we are going to dive deep into the subject of worshipping God. It is more than singing songs of praise! It is more than what happens in this building on this corner. By gathering for worship you may involve yourself in worship- but this hour on Sunday Morning Worship is just one hour in the 168 hours in a week. God has called His creation to worship Him continually. A lifestyle of worship is foundational to a happy, healthy joyful and peaceful life. The Magi are a wonderful 1st century example of worship.

Worship: NT GREEK: *proskyneo*. From two words, *pros-* towards and *kune-* kiss. It means to give obeisance (deferential respect), to offer reverence to. It means to prostrate oneself, bow down, praise.

The first mention historically of worship to God was by angelic beings at the creation- though certainly it was happening for eternity in the past. (Job 38) The most basic subject of worship to God is that He is our creator. Foundationally we are to worship Him because without HIM, we have no life- and there is no earth or universe. All of creation is called to worship Him for this fact. (Ps. 148)
