
PLYMOUTH FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH August 2024

Pastor Paul, to the members and friends of First Baptist Church,

Recently, Sherri and I received a Bible that belonged to her Uncle Ray Streets. Uncle Ray, who is now enjoying his heavenly home was a wonderful man who was my pastor in Johnstown PA. He pastored the same church for over 50 years! He passed away in 2009– yet his legacy lives on. As I was looking

through his Bible– one of many I remember seeing in his office at the church, I was looking for any notes he had taken in the margins. I stumbled onto one such nugget in 1 John 2:1, the Bible is a King James Version of the Scofield Reference Bible. And reads as follows, "*My little children, these things write I unto you, that ye sin not. And if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous:*" The picture to the right shows his notation- "Why do I need an advocate? Because of my Adversary."



What a comfort to know that the Lord Jesus Christ is the Christians advocate as is the Holy Spirit. Through faith in Jesus Christ, in all the things we may face– as we stand against our Adversary, the Devil– the LORD promises to be our Champion. He intervenes and intercedes on our behalf. 1 John 4:2-4 states, "This is how you can recognize the Spirit of God: Every spirit that acknowledges that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God, ³ but every spirit that does not acknowledge Jesus is not from God. This is the spirit of the antichrist, which you have heard is coming and even now is already in the world. ⁴ You, dear children, are from God and have overcome them, because the one who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world." Stand strong in the Lord dear brothers and sisters– The LORD is on your side.

Backpack Ministry

It is time for the Appalachian **Coalfield backpack Minis**try. Our goal is 150 backpacks. This year we are asking that if you would like to contribute to this ministry, you may donate money or contact Phillip Ward for an empty backpack and fill it with the items listed below. The Baptist men will enclose a Bible and a copy of the Christmas Story in each backpack. The deadline for this ministry



is October 16, 2024.

Items that can be included are as follows:

A) Small items of NEW items of warm clothing such as winter hats, gloves, socks, scarves, etc.

B) Small **pop-top canned food** such as ravioli, tuna, beef stew, vegetables, fruit (3-4 cans)

C) At least 1-2 NEW, age-appropriate non-breakable toy (no toy weapons, please!) This can include small cars, balls, dolls, small stuffed animals, yo-yos, jump rope, sidewalk chalk, card games, Legos, etc. For oldest age group (15-17) substitute an appropriate item instead of a toy, such as, a flashlight, small thermos, light blanket, books, hunting and fishing magazines for the boys - jewelry, books, skin care products, hair accessories, etc. for girls. D) Hygiene items including full sized containers of toothpaste, body wash, shampoo, and deodorant, as well as toothbrush, soap, washcloth, brush or comb. (Please fit these items into a one-gallon Ziploc bag so they do not leak out into the rest of the backpack). E) Fresh, wrapped candy (no chocolate please, as it may melt; and no peanut products)

Age Grouping and Labeling. Each backpack should be labeled boy or girl as well as the appropriate age. Age groups for this year are 4-7, 8-10, 11-14, 15-17. Due to labels falling off in previous years, we went to a ribbon system for labeling last year, and it proved to be very effective. Each backpack will have two 10 inch ribbons tied to them - one to indicate gender and one for age, as follows:

Gender:

Blue ribbon will indicate a boy's backpack. Pink ribbon will indicate a girl's backpack.

Age:

Yellow ribbon will indicate that the back pack is for ages 4-7 Green ribbon for ages 8-10 Red ribbon for ages 11-14 White ribbon for ages 15-17.

We ask that you prepare your backpack as you would for your own child or grandchild, with new items, not used ones. This quality gift could be the only Christmas present this child receives and will be a witness of Christ's love!

As always, thank you for your continued support of this ministry.
